

# 2013-2014 GRANT APPLICATIONS

Over the years, the CCA has had great success generating revenues from Arts in the Park, and we take great pride on being able to use some of that income for a variety of improvement and beautification projects in the Carillon neighborhood, as well as to provide grants on an ongoing basis to outside organizations.

The CCA makes a limited amount of this money available in an effort to encourage special programs for various, local non-profit organizations. Members of the CCA are encouraged to contact his or her favorite non-profit to notify them of this grant opportunity. Applications from non-profit organizations or from government entities that support the community (schools, fire stations, etc) which are sponsored by a Carillon Civic Association member will be accepted. CCA will not consider requests for grant requests for general administrative expenses.

Applications must be postmarked by Nov 29, 2013. The Donations Committee will present award recommendations to the CCA Board of Directors for approval. Winners will be announced at the Annual Meeting in April with funds to be disbursed prior to May 1, 2014. 
Changes Coming to the Communications Committee!

#### UNITY CHURCH ANNUAL WREATHS OF WONDER AND ART SHOW



### **NEIGHBORHOOD HISTORY**

Carillon: The Story of a Richmond Community

Carillon resident, Dr. Elizabeth O'Leary will be discussing the history of the Carillon and the surrounding neighborhoods during her lecture at the Virginia Historical Society on November 14 from noon to 1 p.m. She will relate the story of the area's land and people from the colonial frontier to antebellum farmland; Gilded Age streetcar suburb to Jazz Age development; site of post-war housing boom to the hub for civil rights activism in Richmond. The lecture will provide special focus on the formation of the Carillon Civic Association and its role in the turbulent 1960's and '70s in nuturing one of Virgina's first successfully integrated communities. The lecture is free to Virginia Hostorical Society members and is \$5 for adults.



Dr. O'Leary's The Carillon Neighborhood: A History will be on sale following Beth O'Leary's illustrated lecture and at the CCA 45th birthday party. The cost is \$10. ## **COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT**

Latest Update on the Carillon Place Development and the Appeals Process

As many of you have been following this story in our weekly emails, you may be aware that the City of Richmond's Planning Commission has approved One South Realty Group's request of a subdivision plan that would allow for the building of six houses at the corner of Rugby Road and Bute Lane (and the removal of the Vermillion property).



However, just recently, One South Realty Group has entered into discussions with someone interested in purchasing Marlburg and preserving it onsite. This new plan will necessitate significant revisions to the subdivision plan and its resubmission to the City's planning department.

Though the details have not been fully resolved, it appears likely that Marburg will remain standing and that the developer will construct four new houses rather than six. It is possible that two of the houses could be accessed from Marburg's existing driveway, thus reducing the number of additional houses to be accessed from the existing alley. Stay tuned for further developments!
