# GRANTS AWARDED

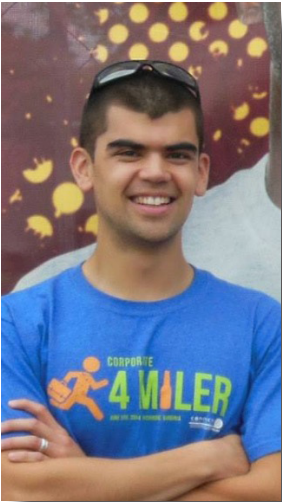

Feedmore, which supports the Meals on Wheels program that provides meals to homebound seniors and adults with disabilities

Full Circle Grief Center, which funds counseling groups in Richmond Schools where students may not otherwise have access to grief counseling

Italian American Cultural Association of Virginia, which maintains the grounds/landscaping surrounding the Columbus statue on South Boulevard

Richmond Peace Education Center, which provides conflict resolution workshops at John B. Cary Elementary and teen-facilitated conflict resolution training at First Unitarian Church

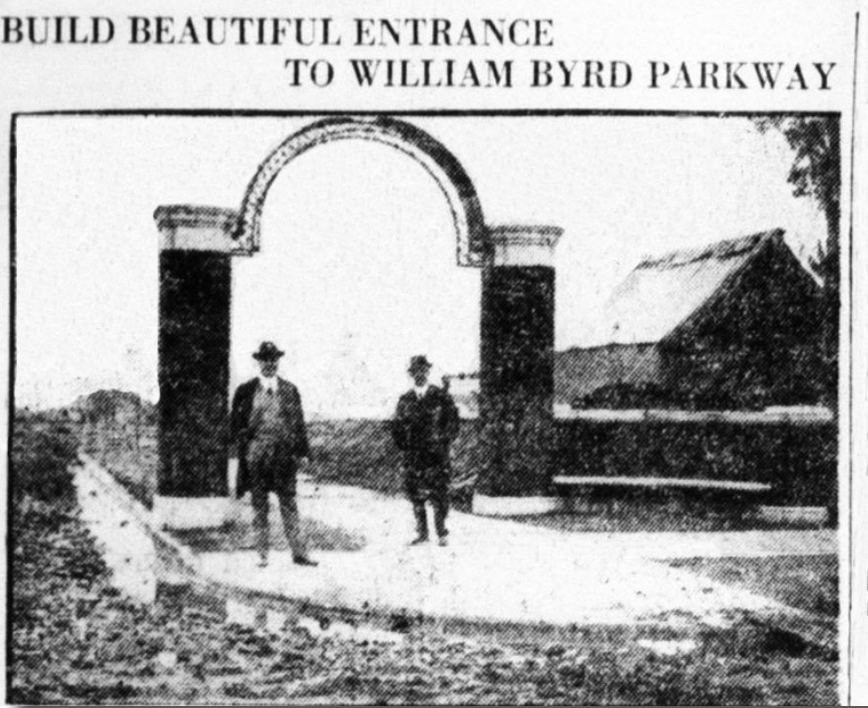
# FALLEN POLICE MEMORIAL

## With Sympathy

Mike Ford, of 3222 Garrett St., died on July 29th. He was predeceased by his mother, Eliza Ford, and is survived by his father, his sister Donna Gillison, and his nephew Ronnie Gillison and neice Connie Jones.

Mike was a soft-spoken “gentle giant” who will be missed by many friends in the Carillon neighborhood where he spent almost his entire life. Our sympathy is extended to his sister, and nephew.

Donald Ford, of 3222 Garrett St., passed away September 23. He was a retired human resources employee of the Defense General Supply Center. He was well respected in the Carillon neighborhood and will be missed by his friends and neighbors. He has a surviving daughter and two grandchildren, and was the widower of Eliza Ford.

Gloria Eaddy, a resident of 3209 Grant Street for over 40 years, passed away on July 2, 2016. She is survived by her husband Joe, three daughters, Antoinette, Rotesia and Andrea, six grandchildren, 2 great-grandchildren and many other relatives and friends.

Gloria worked for Richmond Public Schools for over 30 years. Because of her love for children, she started her own in-home day care service following retirement.

Tom Evans, who moved to Pump House Drive in the Carillon in 1973, passed away at home with family members on June 21. Tom’s life was dedicated to environmental protection and preservation. He was a political lobbyist whose work centered on water quality, sportsman rights, and wildlife protection. He was also passionate about Native American history and spent his last years writing a book about the Migration of the Native American over the past 10,000 years. We extend our sympathy to long-term Carillon residents, Becky and Abby Evans, and to their other family members.
