
**Sharon Hill** served her post well for many years, often including duties in adjoining blocks when necessary. We will miss her presence and send our best wishes as she battles health difficulties.

# HAPPY 100THBIRTHDAY "EAGLEGATES".

On your next walk, pause to mark the centennial anniversary of the ornamental gateway on Rugby Rd. In 1924, developers launched William Byrd Parkway, a new community of grand revival-style residences just west of the park. They laid out lots along 20 acres now bounded by Rugby Rd., Garrett St., Sunset Ln., and Bute Ln. Before the first house was built, they installed streets, utility lines, sidewalks, streetlights, and planted shade trees. They also erected this ornamental gateway opposite open parkland where the state planned to construct a World War I memorial (eventually the Carillon).

This elegant entrance still stands today—a pair of brick pillars topped by iron arches with American eagles and flanked by semicircular benches. In April 1924, a newspaper article pictured it with the developers' "field office" tent standing nearby. That August, an artist's rendering appeared in an advertisement that pronounced it the "Gateway of Opportunity." Construction of new houses flourished until 1930, when the Great Depression brought a long pause and eventual shift in the development of the future Carillon neighborhood.



One side of the new entrance to William Byrd Parkway, nearing completion, showing R. E. Hotze (left) and Field Wilhon, officers of the company, caught on an inspection trip over the premises, where every modern improvement is being installed before the first house is started. The top of the gateway will be surmounted by an engle and the creat of William Byrd. The tent in the background is the company's field office. A similar gateway is located on the officer side of the street, which is parked in the center with a beautiful bed of shrubbery. The Parkway Realty Corporation are constructing sewers, light, gas and other improvement work under specifications and inspection furnished by the city.
